"Going to Darby!!"

The "Class of 2022" will meet their Darby counselors on January 19<sup>th</sup> as they present important information about class selection opportunities at Darby for next year.

The actual online scheduling for 9<sup>th</sup> grade starts on Jan. 22<sup>nd</sup> and ends Jan. 31<sup>st</sup>. Darby Counselors will visit classrooms Jan. 24<sup>th</sup> through Jan. 26<sup>th</sup> to provide assistance.

Darby will host a Parent Information Night on January 22<sup>nd</sup> at 7:00 p.m. in the Darby Performing Arts Center.

Dear Parent or Guardian:

Hilliard City Schools takes seriously the personal, social and physical safety of our students. The adolescent years are marked by a roller-coaster ride of emotions, which can be confusing for youths, their parents, and educators. It is easy to misread depression as normal adolescent turmoil; however, depression appears to be occurring at a much earlier age. In addition, self-injury has become a growing problem among youth.

To proactively address these issues, our District provides instruction in depression awareness and suicide prevention and other mental health issues as part of the 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Health Class curriculum.

The district has chosen to use the Signs of Suicide® (SOS) Prevention Program. This program has proven to be successful at increasing help-seeking behaviors in students who are concerned about himself or herself or a friend. On January 10<sup>th,</sup> we will host a parent information night to share information about this program as well as other mental health concerns.

As part of the instruction, each child will complete an SOS Program screening form. Screenings will be immediately reviewed by our Syntero Counselors and student support, if needed will be provided.

If you do **NOT** wish to have your child participate in the screening portion of the instruction, please send a note to your student's Health teacher by January 15, 2018. If you choose to opt out, then your student will participate in an alternate assignment during the screening.
