Science 7

This general science course is aligned to Ohio's Learning Standards. This science course focuses on helping students use scientific inquiry to discover patterns, trends, structures and relationships that may be described by simple principles. These principles are related to the properties or interactions within and between systems. Students will explore how systems can exchange energy and/or matter when interactions occur within systems and between systems.

Throughout this exploration, students will study cycles and patterns of the earth and the moon; conservation of mass and energy; and cycles of matter and flow of energy.

Social Studies 8

Social Studies 8 is a study of the discovery of America, from Christopher Columbus to the end of the Civil War and Reconstruction. Discover how a simple collection of colonies become the greatest nation on earth, defeating the most powerful monarch of Europe, only to find themselves in a fight over their own land. Students will learn the economic factors that lead to the practice of slavery and the cultural influence that will influence America until this day. See how a nation grows and learn about the greatest leaders and documents of our time, such as the Declaration of Independence, Constitution, and the Bill of Rights. The founding fathers and the sixteen Presidents that follow, are just a few of the examples of people that carved America into the nation we now call home.

Visual Literacy

Offered as a part of the Core Infusion in the 8th grade. Visual Literacy is a class aimed at making students more aware of the visuals presented to them each day. Visual literacy is the set of 21st century skills needed to interpret, recognize, and understand the information presented in these images. Class would be part exploration of topics in visual literacy and part putting these ideas to use in the creation of new artworks, images, and videos.



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The Visual Arts Academy

This course provides a unique opportunity for learners to develop skills and knowledge with a visual arts emphasis. This is beneficial for students interested in exploring careers within the visual arts, as well creating opportunities for design thinking across all content classes. This type of design thinking encourages creativity, collaboration, critical thinking and communication in ways that are both measurable and applicable to future employers and universities.

NEW 3	Project Art and Ecology

This class will be based on current environmental issues with a focus on how to create real world solutions through art. Emphasis will be on the theme of reducing, reusing, and recycling material to create art. It is an ecological art genre and artistic practice that seeks to preserve, remediate and/or vitalize the life forms and resources of the planet. The goal of the course is to educate students about ecology and the artists that dedicate their craft to environmental concerns. This course is available to any 7th or 8th grader. This is a double block course.

This course is for students who are currently playing an instrument such as a guitar, drums, piano, or others typically found in a rock band. This is a semester long introductory survey course of the high school course, Rock Band.

Students will learn the fundamentals of performing and working in today's music industry. Students will experience individual and small group coaching, learn cover songs, and eventually compose and perform their own original music. Students will also learn the basics of sound engineering and music technology. #983100 3 Semester Units



Hilliard City Schools offers the ELite experience for English Learners (EL) students grades 6-12 who need additional time and attention in order to be successful both academically and socially. As part of the ELite program, students will receive intensive English instruction and background knowledge/vocabulary necessary to be successful in all classes. They will be clustered for three periods at The Hub, a part of the Innovative Learning Campus, which will be different than their home school. During the remainder of their day, they will attend their home schools to eat lunch and take courses that are appropriate for their language levels and abilities. Students will receive additional intervention from EL staff, if needed.

Students must go through a referral process before being accepted into the program. Movement in and out of the program is fluid and placement will be reevaluated at the end of each semester. This program is intended to be a temporary placement.

Students new to the country will be given the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment (OELPA) screener. Upon receiving a qualifying score, students will be invited to the ELite program and receive services for a 3 period block. During this time, high school students will earn an English Language Arts credit, a Social Studies elective credit, and a supportive studies elective credit.

This first course in the career field provides students an overview of the opportunities available in the healthcare industry. Students will learn fundamental skills in effective and safe patient care that can be applied across a person's lifespan.

The Health Professionals Academy middle school semester course is designed to expose students to the many opportunities available in the health care field. Students will gain an awareness of different health pathways, along with the education and personal qualities necessary for success in each area. Throughout the term, there will be hands-on activities to gain real-world experience of basic skills such as first aid, and an essential review of anatomy. This course should assist a student that is unsure if the health field is right for them, and also to further refine direction if the student is confident they would like to pursue this direction.
