Math - Day One

Part 1 - Gather a collection of 20 objects (can be coins, matchbox cars, blocks paperclips, etc). Print the attached 1-20 numeral cards (or use playing cards or write the numerals 1-20 on index cards or a piece of paper). Place the numerals cards face down in a stack next to the pile of objects. Have your child select a card from the stack and count out that many objects from the pile. Repeat with all the numeral cards. This activity could also be played as a game where you take turns picking a card and counting out objects.

Part 2 – Create a simple game board with 4 'chutes' (or print attached game board). Each chute consists of a column of about twelve 1-inch squares with a star at the top. Gather a collection of 48 objects (can be coins, paperclips, stickers, etc.) Take turns rolling a dice and collecting the indicated number of objects (if you do not have dice write the numbers 1-6 on index cards and choose one). Place the objects in one of the chutes. The object is to fill all of the chutes with counters. **As an option, require that the chutes be filled exactly. A roll of 5 cannot be used to fill a chute with four spaces.
