WASHINGTON ELEMENTARY PTO MINUTES, SEPTEMBER 6, 2016

Meeting called to Order, 7:06 by Deepa Kellar

Levy Presentation

Mike McDonough (assistant superintendent, operations) and Dawn Sayer (middle level curriculum director): HCSD, November 8th, Levy Issue, two parts, only one vote, 4.5 mill operating levy, \$50 million bond associated. Cost homeowner for every \$100k value, will be about \$169 per year. Key things: lowest asset in over 30 years, in 2011 millage was 5.9, 85% of HCSD budget goes to salary and benefits. School funding put on taxpayers in Ohio, expenditures go up, funding does not change from state perspective. Payroll goes up about 4% every year, state funding revenue goes up about 1%. 4.5 mils go to payroll, \$50 million bond, did facility task force at every level, bond issue will go to capital improvements. Bulk to new middle school, planned near Bradley, "campus feel". Same as Weaver/Davidson concept. Moving Memorial Middle school by Bradley, will re-purpose Memorial middle school as 6th grade. Will have additional bulding movement

- -Cost per pupil, in the middle of cost per pupil, 9th in Franklin County, (16 total), lowest admin cost per pupil in Franklin County
- -majority of \$50 mil to middle school, remaining will be capital improvements throughout district (e.g Tharp new roof cost \$750k), \$460 million in assets in HCSD, \$4.6 million to permanent improvement projects, quickly eaten up with technology, transportation, boils down to about \$1 mill per year
- -Upgrade in security systems is, additional cameras, keycard access to building for staff, middle school 32 cameras, HS, 64, 16 at elementary level
- -Other major projects, roofing, paving, mechanicals
- -if unsuccessful: about 60 staff members cut, 48 teachers.
- -on in fall, if unsuccessful, not going to be on in Spring, one and done, cuts will be permanent.
- -If back on ballot in November 2017, will be to maintain, not to
- -last levy, 2011, promised 3 years, have been able to expand 2 additional years, think this will stretch to 2020

Dawn- our tech budget has remained the same for 10 years, even with getting IPads, not getting textbooks

- -last year saved \$28k in paper costs, 6th through 8th grades
- -Tech example: Canvas, learning management system, used by schools (colleges) that kids go to (BG, OSU), puts kids ahead of navigating the management system in college

- -14 cuts would be elementary, 22 high school, instrumental music teachers, some sports, programming would more likely be cut
- -class sizes might increase
