

## FREE ADMISSIONS

### Free Passes and Complimentary Tickets

There shall be a system of accounting records and reports defining and listing the number of passes and the names and addresses of the recipients of such free passes. This policy shall also cover circumstances under which free passes and free tickets shall be distributed and by whom and shall also list qualifying definitions for recipients.

The Board recognizes that cocurricular activities such as interscholastic athletic events, plays, musical performances, etc., represent an extension of the overall school program and in order for these events to occur, it is necessary to issue free passes or complimentary tickets to specified individuals, including employees and nonschool individuals.

Free passes or complimentary tickets may be issued to employees and nonschool individuals:

1. All District employees and spouses – The administration expects periodically that staff members attend certain events. These staff members shall not be expected to pay admission charges to fulfill the expectation of the administration. A \$10.00 printing charge per pass will be charged and limited to employee and spouse.
2. Music and athletic boosters – Certain members of these organizations assist in the management of events and shall not be expected to pay admission charges.
3. Hilliard mayor, police chief, fire chief (Norwich Township), safety director – These personnel serve to evaluate their employees who have been employed for security purposes. They shall not be expected to pay admission charges.
4. Physicians and spouses – Certain physicians attend to the general welfare of District athletes and shall not be expected to pay admission charges.
5. Workers and spouses – Certain individuals (police for security, emergency squad, parking attendants, concession workers, game timers, game scorers, game announcer, game photographer, game officials, student workers and so on) are employed or volunteer to help and shall not be expected to pay admission charges.
6. Administrators and spouses – District administrators have an evaluative responsibility and shall not be expected to pay admission charges.
7. Benefactors – Certain individuals who present the Board with gifts or services at no cost, that benefit the District, shall not be expected to pay admission charges.

8. Senior citizens, 62 years of age or older, are permitted admission with the purchase of a \$1 lifetime pass to all District activities. Admission will consist of general admission, no reserved seats, non-transferable.
9. Students may receive free or reduced-price passes as part of a reward program, which may include but not be limited to, perfect attendance or renaissance card programs.
