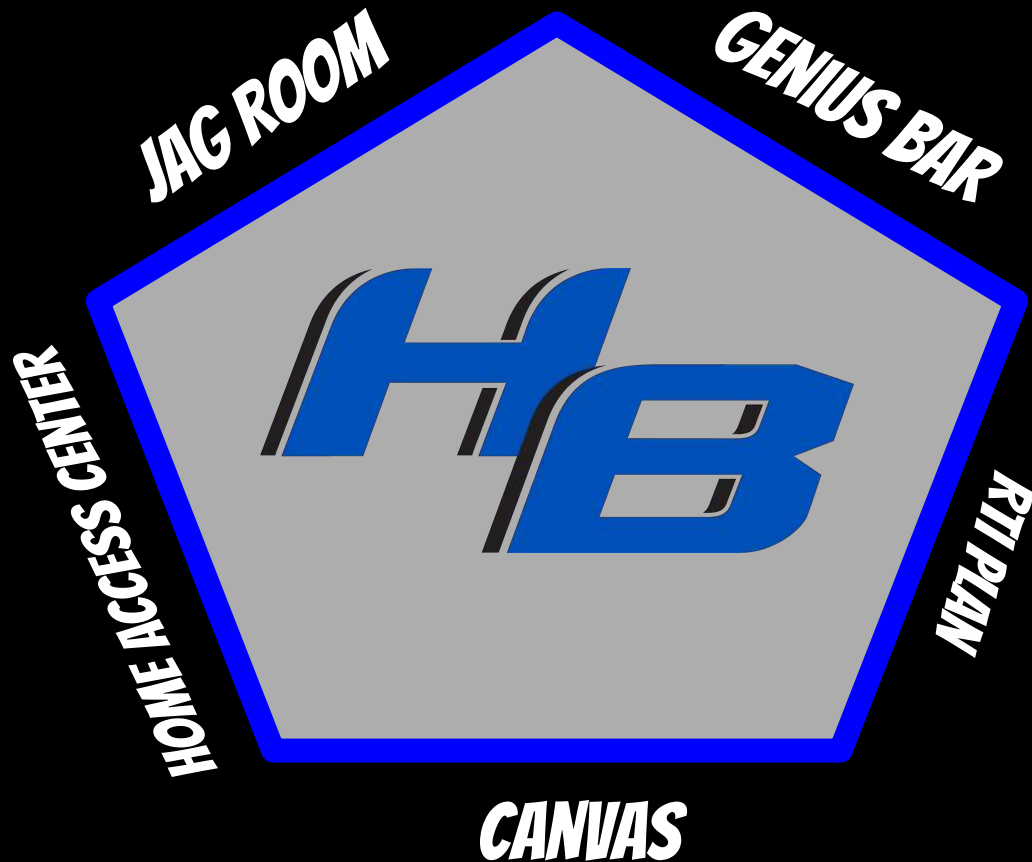

You will need:

21.5 credits

English.....	4
World Studies.....	1
U.S. History.....	1
U.S. Government.....	1
Science.....	3 (one in Biology; 1 in a physical science)
Math.....	4 (must include Algebra 2 or Honors Algebra 2)
Health.....	1/2
PE.....	1/2 (That's TWO semesters)(TWO Seasons)
Digital Connections	1/2
Financial Literacy	1/2 (Sophomore or Junior or Senior Year)
Additional Electives	5 (make sure you have at least 1 Fine Art Credit PE Wavier – 5.5 Electives)
Senior Capstone	1/2 (Will Start in your Junior Year)

Earning an Ohio High School Diploma Classes of 2018 and beyond

There is no one-size-fits-all way to graduate. Ohio gives you several options to qualify for a high school diploma. Choose the way that works best for you!

Remember to Choose the BEST option for you!

Option 1 Score 18 Points on State Tests

Ohio's State Tests

Earn at least 18 points on seven end-of-course state tests.

End-of-course tests are:

Algebra I or Integrated Math I
Geometry or Integrated Math II
American Government
American History

English I
English II
Biology

Each test score earns you up to five graduation points. You must have a minimum of four points in math, four points in English and six points across science and social studies. Your school and district receive grades on the Ohio School Report Cards for all students' scores and participation on state tests.

18 Points on State Tests

For each of the seven end-of-course state tests, a student earns one to five graduation points. Students have the potential to earn a total of 35 points. To meet this graduation option, a student must earn a minimum number of 18 points from the seven tests.

This graduation option gives a student flexibility in accumulating 18 points. A high score on one test can balance a low score on another test. A student must earn a total of at least four points on English tests, four points on math tests and six points on science and social studies tests.

P.E. WAIVER

If you do the following, you will receive credit for your Physical Education Requirement.

Physical Education Waiver

Students in grades 9-11 may be excused from the physical education course requirement by participating in District-sponsored interscholastic **athletics, marching band, or cheerleading** for at least **two (2)** athletic seasons during high school grades 9- 11.

Additionally, you must meet **at least two** of the below requirements:

- Attendance rate of 93 percent during the 12th grade year
- Earn a GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale in all courses completed during 12th grade (must include at least four full-year equivalent, courses)
- Complete a capstone project during 12th grade that the district or school defines
- During 12th grade, complete a work or community service experience totaling 120 hours that the district or school defines;
- Earn a WorkKeys exam score of 3 on each of three test sections;
