## **NEWS RELEASE**

The fifty-second Ohio Governor's Youth Art Exhibition will open for viewing on Sunday, April 24th, at the Rhodes State Office Tower in Columbus. This juried exhibition is comprised of creative expressions in the visual arts created by outstanding and talented students from Ohio's high schools. The exhibition is a cooperative effort between the Governor of Ohio, the Ohio Department of Education, colleges, universities, and business sponsors.

The selection of 348 works of art, created by 9th through 12th grade students, has been accomplished by the following state jurors:
