

English 9A and 9B A student who enrolls in this course must enroll in English 9A and 9B. This course follows a curriculum based on Ohio's Learning Standards for English Language Arts for grade 9. As students work to achieve mastery of the standards, they will read, write about, and analyze literature. Students will practice effective reading strategies for understanding complex texts as they read pieces of classic and contemporary literature, as well as nonfiction and informational pieces. In their work to understand such texts, students will engage in close reading of the literature. Students will also study essay structure and actively engage in the writing process of prewriting, drafting, revising, and editing for various informational, argumentative, and narrative pieces. Time will also be spent studying aspects of grammar and basic writing conventions. English 9A is the first semester of ninth grade English studies, and English 9B is the second semester.

#### Honors English 9

It is recommended for enrollment in this course that students complete Language Arts 8 with a grade of "A" or Honors Language Arts 8 with a grade of "B" or higher. A recommendation from the student's eighth grade English teacher is encouraged. STAR scores may be considered for a student's recommendation to this honors course. Students are expected to have critical reading skills as well as proficient writing and speaking skills prior to enrollment.

Honors English 9 is a yearlong course. The curriculum of Honors English 9 is based on the same standards as English 9, though the studies are with greater depth and at an accelerated pace. This course will include intensive reading and analysis of literature. Extensive annotation of texts will be expected. Students will also work to develop critical writing and speaking skills.


