Interventions



Intervention opportunities will be available for students based on State Testing data, STAR Scores, and/or teacher recommendation. We use a MTSS (Multi-Tiered System of Support) model including:

Panther Center: for Math MTSS, Reading MTSS, and Executive Functioning MTSS

Supported Studies/Decisions: intervention for students with an IEP or who receive EL services

Literacy Explorations: intensive reading intervention that also supports LA class work

Please note, these interventions are not typically scheduled by students/parents; rather, they are selected for students based on the academic need. Students may be placed in/removed from the intervention courses throughout the year based on their current academic progress and need.



Using Home Access Center to select courses for next year

- To access Home Access Center from any browser, type https://homeaccess.hboe.org into the address bar.
- To access Home Access Center from your building website, click on the Student Home Access link.

The login page is simple and straightforward. For students, your Username and Password are the same as what you use to log into the network when you are at school.

- Enter your username and password and then click the 'Log In' button. You will see several buttons
 across the top of the screen. Click on the 'Classes' button.
- Click on 'Requests.'

A screen similar to the one below will appear. To choose course requests for next year, click on the 'Edit' button next to the Middle School department.







Elective Ranking



- Each student must complete an Elective Ranking Google Form in which students will choose 6 electives by priority. These 6 electives must be different than the electives you chose in Home Access during scheduling.
- Unfortunately, sometimes students are unable to get into an elective they registered for due to limited available spots, conflict with other courses they chose, etc. When this happens, school counselors will go to these Rankings and try to schedule their next ranked elective.



Elective Ranking

Each student must complete and submit an 8th Grade Elective Ranking Google Form in case there is a conflict with one or more of the electives you chose during scheduling.


