A Typical Day...

School Starts: 7:55 am

School Ends: 2:40 pm

8 Total Periods including lunch Lunch is a full class period

Students need to fill 7 class periods (units) total (lunch will be automatically scheduled)

- One Semester/Half a year class = .5 units
- Two Semesters/Full year class = 1.0 units

Courses Earning High School Credit



Registration Process

- You will request courses online through the student's Home Access account: <u>Home Access Log in</u>
- 4 core classes have teacher recommendations and are already in their course requests (7th grade will also have PE/Health already in their course requests)
- Specific directions for choosing courses as well as course descriptions and prerequisites can be found in the <u>Middle School</u> <u>Program of Studies</u>

Using Home Access Center to select courses for next year

- To access Home Access Center from any browser, type https://homeaccess.hboe.org into the address bar.
- To access Home Access Center from your building website, click on the Student Home Access link.

The login page is simple and straightforward. For students, your Username and Password are the same as what you use to log into the network when you are at school.

- Enter your username and password and then click the 'Log In' button. You will see several buttons
 across the top of the screen. Click on the 'Classes' button.
- Click on 'Requests.'


A screen similar to the one below will appear. To choose course requests for next year, click on the 'Edit' button next to the Middle School department.

Go to Classes screen > Requests tab





- Each student will complete an **Elective Ranking Google Form** in in class in the coming days.
- Students will choose 10 electives by priority. For example, #1 will be their favorite, #10 will be their least favorite.
- Unfortunately, sometimes students are unable to get into an elective they registered for due to limited available spots, conflict with other courses they chose, etc. When this happens, school counselors will go to these Rankings and try to schedule their next ranked elective.
