- \$35,000 currently in account, approx. \$9,000 in upcoming expenses
- Projected bank of \$25,000 for next school year
- Request to purchase a new kiln for art classroom
  - Repair not option,
  - Replacement approximately \$3,000
  - Mr. Harris proposes a "thank you" fundraiser where families can make clay projects
  - Motion to purchase brought forward, seconded, unanimous vote in favor
- Request to increase budget for 5th grade graduation from \$1,000 to \$1,500
  - This request is to restore to previous levels, had many donations/discounts last year that are not present this year and also class size is larger
  - Motion to purchase brought forward, seconded, unanimous vote in favor
- Request to increase gardening budget to \$500 (one time)
  - Motion to purchase brought forward, seconded, unanimous vote in favor

### **Special Presentation: Digital Parenting**

- Presented by Kathy Parker-Jones, District Digital Resource leader
- Presentation will be made available on PTO webpage
- Discussed addictive qualities of technology
- Children feel more connected through social media whereas adults may find these relationships as "not real"
- Typical usage (entertainment screen time)
  - 6 hours/day ages 8-10,
  - 9 hours/day ages 11-14,
  - 7/5 hours/day ages 15-18
- Suggestions to help kids regulate:
  - Model good behavior
  - Monitor
    - Limit time
    - Remove electronics from bedrooms (e.g., game systems, tvs, mobile devices)
    - Device routines (e.g., bedtime for charging in public space, no devices during homework, meal times)
  - Encourage offline activities (e.g., family game night) and physical activity
- What type of parenting approach do you take? Limiter, Enabler, Mentor
- Monitoring tools on mobile devices (e.g., iOS screen time)
- Tech solutions- Circle by Disney (possible discount for HCSD) with preset age group settings- works with anything that uses wifi in your house
