Attendance Tips from Superintendent Stewart

As you heard in my <u>welcome message</u>, a key focus for our district this year is partnering with our families to reduce absenteeism. I hope you had a chance to review the email sent out with your student's attendance record from last year. Hopefully, it wasn't a surprise, but a good piece of information as we move into this year.

You might be shocked to know that last year across our district, there were 23% chronically absent in grades 6-8. This means they missed more than 18 days.

Throughout the year, we will be sending out information to help keep our students in school. Right now, you can help by setting routines to prepare your student to return. Talk about the exciting things to come, and contact your student's teachers or counselors if you have any concerns.

Notes from the Nurse

Welcome to Weaver 2023-2024! I am the nurse for Weaver and Davidson. I can be reached by phone: 614-921-7710 or email: katy_kennedy@hboe.org Please feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns.

If your student has prescription medication that they will carry or store in the clinic, there must be a completed medication form to accompany each medication. You can access the forms on the district website under the parent tab and click on forms. Each medication will need form "A" (Parent permission) *plus* either form "B" "C" or "D" (Prescriber Authorization). You can also pick one up from the school or I can email the appropriate forms.

Starting in 7th grade, students may carry a day's worth of Over-the-Counter medications with them. It needs to be in original bottle and have Form "A", parent authorization signed and turned in.

If your student has had any changes in their medical history, please contact me. Probably when, not if, your student calls or texts you saying they don't feel well and want picked up, please tell them to come to the clinic so we can help with that process. By coming to the clinic, we can assess their condition and call you.

I hope this year is a good one for you and your student! Let me know if I can be of any help.

In order to receive a roommate selection form, your account must be up to date according to Prodigy Student Travel's payment plan. Therefore, on Friday, August 25th, you should have paid \$620 on your Prodigy account. Your final payment of \$165 will be due on Friday, September 15th.

Preparing for the Trip:

Save the date: the Parent-Student Meeting will be on Tuesday, September 19th at 7:00 pm.

In preparation for the Washington DC Trip, we will need several forms from you. **One of these forms will require a doctor's signature if your child takes a prescription medication**. A signature will not be required for medications such as Tylenol and Dramamine. Knowing that many students will visit their doctor before the start of school, we are attaching the <u>Overnight Trip Medical Permission Form</u> with the hope that you are able to have your pediatrician fill it out at the time of your appointment.

We will also be sending this form, along with another form through a DC Canvas course on August 28th. Parents and students will complete all forms electronically on the iPad and submit them electronically to the Canvas course by September 19th.

Updated Family Trip Rules

On August 14, 2023, the Board of Education voted to amend Policy JED regrading family trips. Effective immediately, each student is limited to one approved trip of FIVE school days or less per school year without loss of academic standing, provided proper assignment make-up work is completed, including tests and final examinations. More than one trip with a cumulative of FIVE days or less may be approved by the building principal or his/her designee. Trips of more than FIVE school days shall not be approved except in extraordinary circumstances as determined by the superintendent or his/her designee. If a student is absent for family travel outside of the FIVE days of excused absences allowed by the District, he/she will be considered unexcused from school and subject to truancy regulations.

Application for approval (JED-E) still must be made by a parent or guardian at least two weeks in advance. Please make note of this change. The handbooks and Board Policy web page will be updated as soon as possible.

Parent/Guardian Book Selection Exemption Form

If you wish to request that a book or resource, **not** be checked out to your student from their Innovation & Discovery/Media Center, you must complete an exemption form. You can access more information and the form by <u>clicking here.</u> Each submitted form will accept up to 10 book titles/author's names. This exemption form is for the current school year, and will need to be filled out each year.

Board Community Conversations
