

Dear Weaver Families,

Thank you for a great start to 23-24! We are proud of the Wildcat energy at 4600 Avery Road.

We want to continue to emphasize the importance of attendance. We want, and we need, our Wildcats to be at WMS! Did you know that 90% of students who missed four days in September went on to be chronically absent last school year? We want to continue to build on the success we are seeing with attendance and continue to see that percentage increase.

# Please see this important message about attendance from our Superintendent:

I am proud to report that this year, we are off to a great start with keeping students in school. On August 28, 2022, our daily attendance rate was 91%, which sounds pretty good, but this year, on August 30, our attendance rate was up to 95%. That means we had 682 MORE students in school. Even a small percentage increase means a lot more students are learning.

As students grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students access learning opportunities and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and on the job. Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful, and on track to graduation.

By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school, and by 9th grade, attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th-grade test scores. Missing just 2 days a month over the course of the school year can affect a student's academic success.

Frequent absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a bully, or facing some other difficulty. Please let us know so we can work with you to help your student.

#### **Tardy Update**

Weaver's staff continues to make instructional time valuable for all learners. With that in mind, students need to be present and ready to learn. We appreciate any steps you have taken to ensure your child arrives to school on time. Now, we also need your help in ensuring your child is making it to class on time. Students will receive a warning after their first four times being tardy to any class during the first nine-week grading period. After that warning, disciplinary consequences may be assigned. If your child has issues arriving on time to any class period on a regular basis, they should discuss that issue with Mr. Hunt, the Assistant Principal.

#### **Car Line Safety**

For parents dropping off students or picking them up via the car line:

For continued safety, please stay in your lane when picking up your child – do not pass any cars in front of you. There are too many vehicles in motion, as well as students walking, and we do not want any unsafe situations.

We know it can be frustrating if it seems to be taking a long time for someone else's child to walk to get picked up — and we will work to move those cars forward to another area so there is a better flow of traffic. Also, please speak with your child about paying attention right when they exit the building and getting into your vehicle as soon as possible.
