B1 School Board Recognition Month: As citizens who serve children and represent their communities, individual school board members face complex and demanding challenges. Yet, few people fully understand the scope and far-reaching implications of board members' responsibilities. All Ohioans should recognize the vital contributions of these men and women and focus attention on the crucial role these elected public officials play in the education of our children. They make a difference for students.

B2 This year in the media center our major goal was to reinvent the great space we have. By moving a few things around and reinventing the existing space, we were able to make three brand new green screen rooms. Cooperating with the tech teacher, Mrs. Feeney, we have been able to take the Media Center to a new level by using the app "Touchcast Studios". So far this year we have hosted multiple class projects and collaborated with teachers to create new ways of expressing content learned throughout a given curriculum unit.

Chinese students completed a "video exchange project" based on the tradition of making "penpals" for our students. While instead of students "writing" letters to communicate we modified it for students to use videos by "speaking" to one another via a personalized video. We called this an International Communicative Cultural Exchange with students at Heritage and students of similar age at our sister school in Hangzhou, China (Greentown Qinqin School). The students communicated with each other over assigned topics.
