

### What is dyslexia?




#### Hilliard City Schools is .....



#### **HCSD Dyslexia Advisory Committee**

#### **PURPOSE:**

To develop a strategic commitment plan for dyslexia awareness in collaboration with parents, teachers, administration, board members, and specialists.



## Where We Are Going Commitment Plan



#### **Communication & Relationships**

- Dyslexia Advisory Committee will meet 4 times a year to gain feedback and monitor commitment plan
- Provide an annual dyslexia awareness parent night to share support and services for struggling readers
- Response To Intervention (RTI) teams will intentionally involve parents in the RTI process and provide resources to support students at home



#### **Screening Tools & Targeted Intervention**

- District will identify a scientific, evidence-based, researched screening tool to identify incoming kindergarten students at risk for phonological and reading difficulties
- Teachers will administer a scientific, evidence-based, researched screening tool to all kindergarten and first grade students
- Targeted scientifically and evidenced-based intervention within 30 days of at risk identification



#### **OG Instructors & Intervention**

- The district will make available an intervention period for each secondary (6-12) student on an IEP and/or 504 plan
- All elementary schools will have a trained OG general education reading support teacher
- All Hilliard City school buildings will have at least one certified OG instructor who has received 30 hours of coursework and 30 hours of practicum available to provide specialized instruction for students with a disability
- The district will establish a committee that includes parents, teachers, district curriculum leaders, and special education coordinators to research secondary intervention curriculum

#### **Professional Development**

- Professional development for administrators, coaches, and school psychologists
- District will create a Canvas course on dyslexia awareness as a resource for all staff and require all new teachers to complete as a condition of employment
- Provide IEP and 504 accommodation compliance training annually to all teachers
- The district will train a building team of K-2 general education and intervention specialists in the implementation of a scientifically researched based multi-sensory methodology



#### Dyslexia Service Plan



Phase 1- All students will be administered universal screeners

<u>Phase2-</u> Response to Intervention (RTI) - a multi-level instructional framework aimed at improving outcomes for all students

<u>Phase 3</u>- Evaluation- The response to intervention team in collaboration with parents, will review the student's performance data to determine if it supports the need for an evaluation
