MEETING NOTES

Meeting Notes are not official until voted on by the Board of Education at its following Regular Meeting.

- A1 President called the meeting to order at 6:31 p.m.
- A2 Members present: Mark Abate, Paul Lambert, Nadia Long, Brian Perry, and Lisa Whiting
- A3 Everyone recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

B PROGRAMS / PRESENTATIONS

- B1 Division 1 State Wrestling Champion – Bradley Weaver, Darby High School

Joyce Brickley, the Principal, introduced Brad Weaver. Brad is Darby High School’s first State Wrestling Champion. Brad’s record this season was 32-0, making him the first undefeated wrestler at Darby HS. Also, he did not give up an offensive point, carried a 4.0 GPA the first semester, and won the Casey Frederick Award for the best overall wrestler in the Central District. We are super proud of Brad! Brad said that he would be playing football and studying business at Ohio University in the Fall. The Board congratulated Brad on his accomplishment.

Mr. Abate announced that Celia Schulte, a Weaver MS student, won and set the State record for the 1600 and was the runner-up in the 800. The Board offered their congratulations to Celia as well.

- B2 COVID-19 Update – Mr. Mike Abraham, Director of Student Well-Being

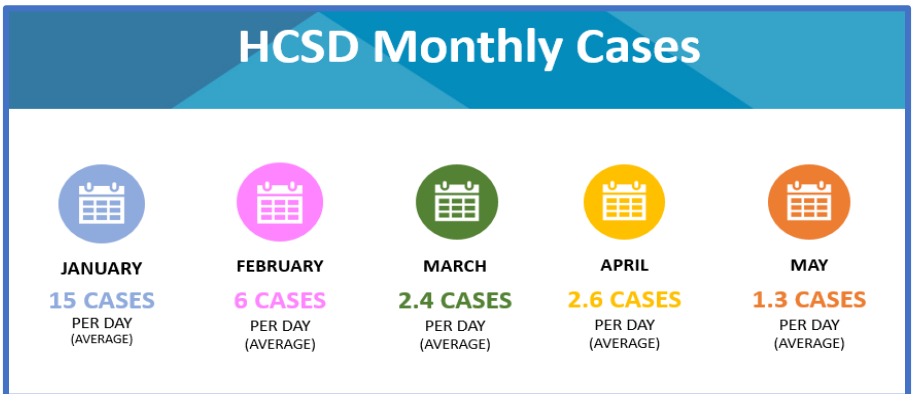
Mr. Abraham stated that the CATS data shows that our percentage of positive school-age cases remains green at 18.4%. Also, we have not met any of our district thresholds – student absences, staff absences, and nurse visits.

As you see in the chart to the right, our total number of positive cases per day has decreased. In January, we averaged 15 positive cases per day and are now (May) averaging only 1.3 cases per day.

In the last two months, we have had only four staff members test positive and are most likely due to our vaccinated staff.

We have had several questions about mask-wearing since receiving the newly announced CDC guidelines for fully vaccinated individuals. We are

currently under a Health Order requiring all K-12 students and staff to wear a mask in our facilities. We have also received a letter from Governor DeWine stating, in part, *“While Ohio will be amending its health orders to comply with this new CDC guidance, in order to maintain consistency and model safe behavior for Ohio’s students, these changes do not affect the existing order requiring the use of facial coverings and other health protocols in our schools. With limited numbers of students vaccinated, it is important that we continue these safety measures through the end of the current school year.”*

We understand that Governor DeWine has said he will lift all health orders on June 2. We are waiting for guidance and clarification, and I will give you that information as soon as I receive it.

We have informed our building principals that students may remove their masks when they are outside and maintain six feet of social distance.

Mr. Perry asked Mr. Abraham for clarification on the current mask requirement for students and staff. Mr. Abraham responded that we are under a health order (*not a recommendation or guideline*) that requires all K-12 students and staff to wear a mask in our schools.

Mrs. Long asked if we have received any guidance for the fall. Mr. Abraham answered that he asked Franklin County Public Health (FCPH) how lifting health orders on June 2 will affect schools. At this time, FCPH does not have an answer. FCPH is asking for guidance and clarification from the Ohio Department of Health and will pass that information to us as soon as they can.

Beth Murdoch, 3056 Hemlock Edge Dr., Hilliard 43026

I want to address a very sensitive topic – Hilliard’s approach to diversity, equity, and inclusion. First, let’s reflect on the definitions. Diversity – the condition of having or including people from different ethnicities and social

backgrounds. Equity – the state or quality of being just and fair. Inclusion – the act of including someone or something as part of a group. Based on these definitions, I believe every parent, teacher, and community member must support your efforts to ensure every student receives a diverse, equitable, and inclusive education. Racism exists. It is sad, awful, and damages our soul. However, when I read documents from Hilliard’s Equity and Diversity Task Force referencing antiracism, it’s clear this group has adopted components of critical race theory. Critical race theory holds that America is fundamentally racist yet teaches students to view every social interaction and person in terms of race. Its adherents pursue antiracism through the end of merit, objective truth, and the adoption of race-based policies.

I will assume positive intent and give the benefit of the doubt that critical race theorists intend to erase inequalities to achieve racial equity. But what specifically are they proposing? I support many of the committee’s recommendations assuming the positive intent carries through into the execution. For example, I support updating the student handbooks to specifically address racism and racist incidents assuming the instances of discrimination provided as unacceptable are apparent in intent. I support revising the K-12 English and language arts resources to include multiple cultural perspectives assuming the selected texts align with the curriculum. I support ensuring the employees of HCSD are representative of the students and families in the district, assuming this is achieved via a diverse slate of candidates presented during the hiring process and the best candidate is offered the job regardless of race. My concern is not with efforts to address diversity, equity, and inclusion. It is with executing these goals with a lens towards critical race theory’s main tenet that there is racism in our systems, in our silence, and our social constructs. Executing the equity and diversity strategic action plan under the lens of critical race theory means that students, faculty, and staff are subjected to training that denigrates America. It creates problematic methods where students are asked to rank their privilege, required to apologize for beliefs they have not been proven to hold, and actions they have never taken. Critical race theory creates even more division under the guise of solving it. There is no opt-out, and there is no right to be left alone. In terms of the activists, silence is violence. Being silent is alleged to be an act of violence. It’s time to call out critical race theory for what it is, employ every means possible to end its use, and model the true rejection of racism by building bonds of genuine friendship, love, and service to all.

Allison & Reese Dorco, 5447 Thorney Dr., Hilliard 43026

Allison: We thank you for making the decision to go back to all-in five days and abandoning the link to the faulty color-coded system. This type of adjustment is what we expect from a school district the caliber of Hilliard City Schools. As the recommendations are changing and evolving, we expect Hilliard to evolve. Recently, we found out that Ben Logan Local Schools has given a choice back to parents on whether or not they want to mask their children. They have shown that a school district can make choices even if the state makes mandates. We need to start now to give the expectation for the fall. My daughter, Reese, would like to speak about how masks make her feel.

Reese: Wearing a mask makes me feel sad because I can’t see people’s expressions. It just looks like we are staring, and it is socially awkward. I hate it when the mask goes in my mouth. In gym class, I have a hard time breathing, especially with my asthma. Since we have been all-in, I often wear my mask outside, even when playing by myself. It’s especially hard to breathe when I’m out in the heat. I just want to breathe fresh air like I used to be able to. I also want to see what people look like without their masks. People’s faces shouldn’t be weird to see; it shows who we are.

Allison: Now that teachers have been given the opportunity for a vaccine, it’s time to start letting parents choose how to mitigate risk with our own children best. I don’t believe any of you are responsible for the health of my child. That’s my job. Research has proven that kids are at minimal risk of COVID-19. The CDC has been clear on their guidance that outdoor masking is unnecessary. This week we are going to have temperatures near 90

degrees. The district doesn't want to be liable if the kids get heat stroke due to an outdated policy. Recess policies are different at every elementary school, and restrictions need to be removed immediately. This should be a district decision, not up to individual schools.

The other policy that needs immediate attention is the one banning parents from school buildings. We discovered this week; this is also an inconsistent policy. Reese came home in tears because she was tasked with telling me I wasn't invited to her fifth-grade graduation clap-out.

Reese: When I found out my parents weren't able to come to my graduation, I was sad because I want them to see this once-in-a-lifetime thing I get to do. I cried. I want them to come; they taught me for half of the year.

Allison: We discussed this issue with the school office, and they said it was policy. Since then, I have spoken with a parent that had been at her child's sixth-grade choir concert in the gym at Hilliard Station. Also, Davidson HS held a robing ceremony with parents in the building for several hours this weekend. It looks like the rulings are inconsistent. When the COVID-19 shutdowns began, parents become everything to their children. They were stripped of all other human contacts. So now, you are telling these kids that the people who have been there for them the past fifteen months cannot celebrate this huge milestone with them. We are being robbed of sharing these memories with our children. This year has been hard on everyone, and I'm asking you to reconsider your stance on allowing parents to participate in the last day of school fifth-grade activities.

Reese: I want school to go back to normal because it's not fun to wear masks and social distance from our friends. We have been distancing and masking for over a year, and COVID is ending. We want our normal lives back. I feel like we are being punished for something that was not our fault. Please give us back our childhood. Thank you.

Alisha Duke, 2443 Punderson Dr., Hilliard 43026

I have two children attending Hilliard City Schools. I came to speak to you about my concerns about our district and its future. My first concern is the mask and vaccination policies that will be put into place for next fall. We now have the opportunity to vaccinate against COVID, and by next school year will have no excuse for why we are continuing to force masking in our buildings. The teachers and staff have had time to be vaccinated, we have seen super-spreading by children, and hospitalizations are decreased and no longer a strain on our system. I am requesting that masks be optional for the next school year and not be contingent on the vaccination status of our children. With freedom of choice, we put the power back in the parent's hands for their children's safety and what makes them feel comfortable. If you feel comfortable with a vaccine and a mask or without a vaccine and a mask, great. We are at a place where masks have damaged our children socially, emotionally, and mentally. Masks need to be at the parent's discretion. One of my children, who used to love going to school, asked me not to make her go back to school for the rest of the year because of masks. I can't argue enough for you to consider masks as an option for the next school year. Allow parents to make health decisions for their children instead of the district making them.

Additionally, it should be policy in our district to not discriminate against children who would choose to be maskless in the fall. Their choices, reasons and vaccine status is no one else's business. They are personal, private, medical decisions for each person. Anyone who does not feel comfortable without a mask can choose to wear one with discrimination or retribution.

My second concern is about using critical race theory in our school district. As a school system, your job is to teach our children reading, writing, and arithmetic, as the saying goes. Your job is to teach our children how to think, not what to think. You are failing them. Equity is a word being thrown around a lot these days, but I'm here to remind you that equity is not equality. I am absolutely for equality and diversity. I am not for someone

teaching my child that the color of her skin defines her. I am not for someone telling her that she is either an oppressor or a victim and can't be anything in between. I am tired of our school administration and teachers feeling like it's okay to lift up some cultures at the expense of others, all while trying to say you are inclusive. I am boldly advocating for a specific policy statement to our staff that critical race theory not be taught to our children. You have preached that you cherish inclusion and diversity, but all the critical race theory does is teach children why they are different and why it is bad to be one race or another. This swings in the opposite direction of what you are trying to achieve, understanding and appreciating those different from yourself. You should take a moment to consider what you are trying to achieve.

Mechele DeMatteo, 6230 Lafferne Ln.

I have two children attending the school district. This school system embraces the ideology of critical race theory (CRT) and has quickly made it a large part of the curriculum. This must stop. After realizing the Marxist ideology in CRT, several states have bills to ban it from being taught in their schools. We should be doing this as well. The premise underlying CRT is correct – racial inequality is shockingly pervasive. It has some valid insights, but it goes bad by seeking to impose itself through intimidation and power. It's not the power that comes from persuasion in an election but from silencing critics and insisting that those who are not with you are against you. My three minutes do not give me enough time to go over everything that makes CRT a bad idea. I want to share a few examples of what CRT looks like in practice across the nation: (1) Having first-graders deconstruct their racial and sexual identities and rank themselves according to their power and privilege. (2) Having middle school teachers locate themselves on an oppression matrix based on the idea that straight, white, English-speaking, Christian males are the main members of that oppressive class. Then they tell the teachers they must atone for their privilege and covert, white supremacy. (3) School districts tell white teachers that they are guilty of spirit murder against black children and must bankrupt their privilege in acknowledging their thieved inheritance. These are quotes. How is this not divisive? If you disagree with CRT or question any part of the theory, you must be a racist. According to CRT, if you side with CRT, you are only doing it to make yourself look better, making you a racist. You cannot win. That is how CRT is designed, so no one speaks against it. It is Marxism at its best. CRT takes a person's individuality and humanism away from them. They become judged based on the color of their skin and not the quality of their character. We should learn from the atrocities of our history and seek not to divide but to heal. There is no healing in CRT, only oppressors and the oppressed. We need to find a better way. Let's find the tools that enable us to go beyond the racial and ethnic conflicts together. Do unto others as you would have them do unto you. This should be the golden standard in our schools, not placing children in groups and using divisive language. Please stop teaching our children to consider the color of someone's skin before considering the human inside. It's the absolute definition of racism.

- F2 The Board of Education authorized the 2021-2022 Membership in the Ohio High School Athletic Association by adopting the following resolution:

Whereas, the Hilliard City Schools of 2140 Atlas Street, Columbus, 43228, Franklin County, Ohio, has satisfied all the requirements for membership in the Ohio High School Athletic Association, a voluntary unincorporated association not-for-profit; and

Whereas, the Board of Education (“Board”) and its Administration desire for the schools with one or more grades at the 7-12 grade level under their jurisdiction to be voluntary members of the OHSAA;

Now therefore, be it resolved by the Board of Education/Governing Board that the district’s middle and high schools do hereby voluntarily renew membership in the OHSAA and that in doing so, the Constitution, Bylaws and Business Rules of the OHSAA are hereby adopted by this Board as and for its own minimum student-athlete eligibility requirements. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Board reserves the right to raise the student-athlete eligibility standards as it deems appropriate for the schools and students under its jurisdiction; and

Be it further resolved that the schools under this Board’s jurisdiction agree to conduct their athletic programs in accordance with the Constitution, Bylaws, Regulations, Business Rules, Interpretations and decisions of the OHSAA and to cooperate fully and timely with the Executive Director’s Office of the OHSAA in all matters related to the interscholastic athletic programs of the schools. Furthermore, the schools under this Board’s jurisdiction shall be the primary enforcers of the OHSAA Constitution, Bylaws, Sports Regulations, Business Rules and the interpretations and rulings rendered by the Executive Director’s Office. The administrative heads of these schools understand that failure to discharge the duty of primary enforcement may result in fines, removal from tournaments, suspension from membership and/or other such penalties as prescribed in Bylaw 11.

- F3 The Board of Education approved the revised 5-year forecast.

Mr. Wilson stated this is the same forecast that we reviewed at the April 19 Board meeting.

Mr. Lambert added that he has said for years that we have four big nobs to turn relative to our financial strategy. First is our spending in particular for growth in compensation and benefits. The second is the interval between levies, and the third is the size of the subsequent levies. Fourth is the amount we hold in our cash reserve. We can set any three of those variables but have to live with what those choices do to the fourth nob. If the rate of spending growth increases, the amount of new money needed grows and drives the levy size up and the interval down. The longer the interval between levies, the larger they will likely need to be. In 2016, we decided we wanted to put a levy on the ballot simultaneously as presidential elections because we feel the higher voter turnout better reflects the profile of our community. We wanted those levies to be on the small side, which means remaining disciplined in our spending, and we have been.

Conversely, the smaller we want to keep the levy request, the more frequently we will need to be on the ballot. As we absorbed the impact of rapid enrollment through the 1990s and capped state funding, our levy requests were both large and frequent. It was a difficult time with multiple tries for passage and spending reductions. Most people in our community still don’t understand the connection between all of that residential growth and the lasting impact it has had on our funding needs. I hope we continue to work on that education effort because it is starting up again with new developments like Carr Farms, Alton

Place, Sugar Farm, Hill Farm, and more to come. With the slowing in enrollment growth in recent years, improved state funding, and a continued disciplined approach to spending growth, our cash balance has grown to a substantial level, projected to be 38% of our general fund spending at the end of the fiscal year 2021. That cash reserve is what allowed us to skip the levy request we had planned for 2020 and will, according to the forecast, allow us to wait until 2022 and still keep the size of the levy reasonable. Our current policy states we will endeavor to keep our cash balance above 10% of current general fund spending. Our treasurer has recommended increasing the percentage in our policy to 20%, and I agree. It means we have to time our levies to prevent the cash balance from falling below that level. This doesn't include the money required to maintain our beautiful facilities. I am eagerly awaiting the analysis from our Operations department that will tell us how much we need to increase our permanent improvement levy to keep our facilities in the condition our community expects. We are well short of where we need to be and will need to ask the voters to increase their permanent improvement levy commitment to getting back on track. We should expect that all new residential development in the works will drive the need to construct some new buildings, likely new elementary buildings first. Given how much labor and material costs have increased in the last couple of years, these buildings will likely be very pricey, even with our simple architectural standards. Low interest rates might help when we need to ask for new bond levies, but there are signs of inflation on the horizon, and the days of cheap borrowing may not last. A key strategic decision for this Board will be when to do new construction – soon, while interest rates are low and materials are expensive or later when material costs may come down but interest rates are much higher. I talk a lot about finances. Some may perceive it's the only thing about which I care. While that's not true, we cannot achieve any of our priorities if we run out of gas. If we let our finances get out of whack, it becomes the driver of all conversations. Finally, I thank Mr. Wilson and his team for doing a masterful job of managing the financial side of our house.

Ms. Whiting thanked the policy committee for all of their hard work. Mr. Perry noted the change in Policy KD that affects our public participants. We will no longer require participants to state their home address before speaking, but it will still be part of the public record.

F5 The Board of Education authorized the Chief Operating Officer to renew the contract with the Liberty Mutual Insurance Company administered by Marsh & McLennan Agency, LLC for the District property, liability, and fleet insurance package for the coverage period of 7-1-21 through 6-30-22 for the annual premium amount of \$487,537.00.

Mr. Lambert asked how this premium compares to prior years. Mr. Hetzel responded that this premium is a 5% increase over last year’s coverage. The industry is facing double-digit increases due to COVID-19 liability exposures, and that is why our premium increased. We looked at super deductibles and different approaches, but they haven’t created the material savings we wanted. Because we had low loss ratios this year and low property rates due to facilities in good condition, our 5% increase are due to increasing automotive liability (school buses). We feel very good about a 5% increase while many others are facing double-digit increases.

- F6 The Board of Education accept the contract from Mobilease Modular Space, Inc. for the placement of a 4-Classroom Modular Complex at Ridgewood Elementary that will include: Engineering, Site Planning, Foundations, Freight, and Installation with HVAC, Life Safety, Electrical, and ADA accommodations with overhead Canopy. The purchase is made through the Keystone Purchasing Network’s (KPN) public bid process for a total cost of \$439,228. Contract #KPN-201902-01A.

Mr. Lambert asked if this is due to enrollment growth at Ridgewood. Mr. Hetzel explained that it is due to spacing needs and capacity challenges. We feel like a four-room complex will address both of these needs in the short term. This is not a permanent solution.
