

## Notice of Public Participation for Federal Grants

Hilliard City Schools receives federal funding through the Special Education - IDEA (Part B) grant to assist with the education of handicapped children, ages 3 through 21. The District also receives funding through Title I, Title II-A, Title III, Title IV-A and the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund.

### Major Allocations FY23

**IDEA-B** - Special Education \$3,800,000 - Intervention teachers, classroom aides, nursing, ASL Interpreting and speech therapy.

**Title I** - \$2,300,000 – Reading/Math intervention staff, family engagement, summer parent/student programming, and intervention support services.

**Title II-A** - \$400,000 – Instructional coaching and staff professional development.

**Title III** - \$252,000 – EL support services and EL tutors.

### One Time Allocations

**ARP ESSER III** - \$4,215,000 - Original allocation received in FY21 – final amount to be expended in FY24.

Funds are to be used to respond to the pandemic and to address the academic impact of lost instructional time as a result of COVID-19 by providing evidence-based interventions to respond to students' academic, social, and emotional needs and address the disproportionate impact of coronavirus on student populations including students from low-income families, students of color, English learners, children with disabilities, students experiencing homelessness, and children in foster care.

The District is utilizing these funds to provide additional Reading/Math Intervention teachers, English Learner teachers, speech pathologists, school counselors, and social workers.
