Report out on events since our last meeting:

2. Principal Update

- Washington Gives Back first month activity for September featured giving among students making bookmarks for others.
- All beginning of the year assessments have been completed.
- IDC is open and running, students are enjoying their time spent here.
- Kindergarten and first grade will continue to leave iPads at school at least through January.
- Walk-a-thon and fall social were two great events.
- Student leadership team has begun. This group is made up of third, fourth, and fifth grade students. The first meeting took place today with the third grade group. The third grade group worked on planning a spirit week to take place in December with a theme of culture.
- Monday, October 3rd the first Wolfie Way recipients will be announced.
- The week of October 17th will be fall conferences. The late evening will be Wednesday, October 19th. Conferences will follow a common framework centered around three main topics: 1. What is known about each student 2. How it is known 3. What the support plan will be for the student. Conferences will be

offered on zoom and in person depending on teachers and parents needs. Communication regarding conference schedules will be sent to families by this Friday, September 30th.

- The Book Fair will be held during conference week (week of October 17th) it will be open during the evening of conferences on Wednesday, October 19th.
- The first spirit week will be planned by the fifth grade leadership team and will be held the week of October 17th.
- Washington Gives Back October project will be Socktober sock drive.

Review of Commitment Plan

 - 1. Creating and maintaining a respectful environment, staff demonstrating regard for student perspective, experiences, and different cultures.
 - 2. Focus groups of students:
 - IDC advising group (4th and 5th graders)
 - Student leadership team (3rd, 4th, and 5th graders)
 - Student check in's
 - 3. Community ambassadors people coming in from our community to share what they do for a living as well as lived experience.
- Engaging Experience:
 - 1. Provide high interest experiences where students can think deeply and solve real world problems.

Reviewing the framework of Portrait of a Graduate, the district is seeking a 300 person committee for this project that will last 4 months to gather ideas and then begin creating a strategic plan for HIlliard City Schools. If you are not chosen to be on the committee you can apply.

-Reviewed Hilliard results on state report card - as a district 18 out of 20 areas made significant gains. Hilliard City Schools made great strides overall on the state report card.

-HIlliard foundation is offering \$5000 grants teachers can apply for.
