Having 60% or more of students reaching the 50% growth percentile on Star Assessments and making increases on Acadiance Assessments.

4. Treasurer's Report

Review of the budget for the year.

- Movie night screen cost \$1300, added \$200 estimate in profit to this event for selling our own snacks.
- Spirit wear estimate of our profit from these sales in the budget.
- -Walk-a-thon goal \$16500 in profit after spending \$3000 on shirts.
- -Flower Sale projected profit of \$4500.
- -Kroger projected profit of \$400 for the year.
- -Spirit Nights projected profit \$750 for the year.
- -Chiller costs us a little money, not an event for profit.
- -Silent Auction varies year to year depending on baskets, \$2500 projected profit.

- -Fall and spring Festivals \$1500 to spend on each event, intent to be celebrations vs money raising opportunities.
- -Winter Luncheon upping the budget from \$1800 to \$2500.
- -Wolfie Welcome Day budget of \$1500 for popsicles given, do sell spirit wear for profit.
- -Teacher Support each teacher receives \$200 to spend on supplies. New teachers receive \$250. Special budget: art \$2000 (increased from \$1500 last year), music and gym \$1500, and Spanish \$750.
- -Principals Fund \$1500 used at principal's discretion throughout the year.
- -Staff Appreciation \$1800 total, split in two ways \$750 will be used throughout the year for things, and the rest will be used for Teacher Appreciation Week in May.
- -Mini Grant \$1800 spent on a first come, first serve basis. Teachers have to apply.
- -Conference Night \$800, budget decreased this year based on previous spending.
- -Veterans Day \$100 for breakfast after assembly.
- Publishing Shop \$200 for supplies
- -Wolfie Way \$1300 for the year for breakfast/ \$150 per month.
- -Safety Patrol \$200 for new sashes if needed and parties.
- Field Day \$2500 total, \$2000 for equipment and \$500 for supplies.
- Class Parties K 2: \$400 total/ \$100 per class. 3-4: \$300 total/ \$100 per class. 5th grade: \$300 for class parties/ \$100 per class. \$950 for yard signs and end of the year celebration.
- -Memorial/Bereavement \$100
- -Welcome Bags \$750 Kindergarten t shirts
- -Field Trips \$600 per grade level, this was increased this year from \$400 per grade level.
- General \$100
- -Accounting \$80
- -ISPTO dues \$35
- -Popcorn and Sno Cone supplies \$100
- -Artist and Community \$500 per grade level, total of \$3000. Grade levels can pull their money together. This year Mrs. Riley has made it a goal to use these funds.
